# **District Health Representative's Report**



#### I have two quick questions for you:

1. Did you receive your copy of Communiqué – RTOERO 2023 Health Benefits Update late last year?

Communiqué is published annually and sent to members by mail. It provides an overview of any changes made to insurance plans and processes. If you did not receive your copy, go to https://rtoero.ca/resources/communique-insurance-plan-updates/ and download a copy. If you do not have a device by which to connect to the Internet, call the RTOERO Office (1-800-361-9888) and request a copy be sent to you.

2. If you did receive your copy of Communiqué, did you read it?

If you did read it, you likely noticed the following significant change in submitting claims:

As of January 1, 2023, the RTOERO policy will require you to submit Claims within six months from the date the expense was incurred.

As your District Health Representative, I receive regular information memos from the Marketing and Communication Team at RTOERO. I noted the following information in the February 2023 "News You Can Use" memorandum:

Did you know that the spouse or dependent of an RTOERO member with extended health insurance can join the dental plan, even if the primary member doesn't?

Details about RTOERO's dental plan are available at rtoero.ca/ insurance/dental-plan or contact the RTOERO benefits team to discuss your needs. (Source "NewsYouCanUse" – February 2023).
